### International keynote speakers

**ANMOL VELLANI** is a theatre director, philosopher and Executive Director of the Indian Foundation for the Arts (IFA) which supports more than 100 projects in 17 states of India. India has a long tradition of embedded community art. Vellani is well placed to talk about community-based art development, given IFA's startling array of experiences.

**BOB McNULTY** is the Founder and President of Partners for Livable Communities, USA, a thirty year old organization dedicated to promoting quality of life, economic development and social equity. She was a general manager, producer and management consultant in the arts before joining Arts Victoria where she was responsible for arts policy and industry development.

MARTIN MULLIGAN, is Deputy Director and Senior Research Fellow, Globalism Research Centre, RMIT, Melbourne. He recently led the research team for the 'Generations' project, in which he investigated outcomes of the community based arts projects in five local government areas around Australia.
